

Verba. Anexos

History.

The initial volume in the *Verba* monograph series was a study by the first editor of the journal, Constantino García, on the vocabulary of the Compostela area (*Léxico de la comarca compostelana*, 1974). Along the same lines, intended to make available the inherited lexis of Galician, several successive volumes on vocabulary and onomastics were published, as well as dialectological and ethnographic contributions; for example, on the Galician of Ferrol (J. A. Porto Dapena, *El gallego hablado en la comarca ferrolana*, Anexo 9, 1977) and of Verín (M. Taboada, *El habla del valle de Verín*, Anexo 15, 1979).

The first three years of the journal also saw the publication of three influential studies on the verbal system of Galician: G. Rojo, *Perífrasis verbales en el gallego actual* (Verbal periphrases in modern Galician, Anexo 2, 1974); A. Santamarina, *El verbo gallego* (The Galician Verb, Anexo 4, 1974); and F. G. Gondar, *O infinitivo conxugado en galego* (The Inflected Infinitive in Galician, Anexo 13, 1978). Later *Verba* monographs have studied other aspects of Galician grammar, including I. González Fernández, *Sufijos nominales en el gallego actual* (Nominal Suffixes in Modern Galician, Anexo 11, 1978) and C. Silva Domínguez, *Frases nominais con posesivo en galego. Estructura e valores referenciais* (Noun Phrases with a Possessive in Galician: their structure and reference, Anexo 50, 2002).

Gradually, research monographs concerning Spanish have also come onto the list, as well as diachronic studies. The following monographs on Spanish stand out for their importance within their academic field: G. Rojo, *Cláusulas y oraciones* (Clauses and Sentences, Anexo 14, 1978); J. Pena, *La derivación en español. Verbos derivados y sustantivos verbales* (Derivation in Spanish: derived verbs and deverbal nouns, Anexo 16, 1980); J. M.^a García-Miguel, *Transitividad y complementación preposicional en español* (Transitivity and Prepositional Complements in Spanish, Anexo 40, 1995); A. Veiga, *Condicionales, concesivas y modo verbal en español* (Conditional and Concessive Clauses and their Moods in Spanish, Anexo 34, 1991); J. Pena, *Usos anómalos de los sustantivos verbales en el español actual* (Uncanonical Uses of Deverbal Nouns in Modern Spanish, Anexo 6, 1976); and T. Jiménez Juliá, *La coordinación en español. Aspectos teóricos y descriptivos* (Coordination in Spanish: theoretical and descriptive aspects, Anexo 39, 1995).

Among the diachronic studies, the best known include: G. Rojo and E. Montero,

La evolución de los esquemas condicionales (Potenciales e irreales desde el Poema del Cid hasta 1400) (The Evolution of Possible and Counterfactual Conditionals from the *Poema De Mio Cid* to 1400, Anexo 22, 1983); C. Folgar, *Diacronía de los objetos directo e indirecto (del latín al castellano medieval)* (The Diachrony of Direct And Indirect Objects from Latin to Medieval Castilian, Anexo 37, 1993); the re-edition of V. García de Diego, *Elementos de gramática histórica gallega (Fonética-Morfología)*. (first ed. 1909: Elements of Galician Historical Grammar: Phonetics and Morphology, Anexo 23, 1984); and H. Meier, *Notas críticas al DECH de Corominas/Pascual* (Critical notes on the Etymological Dictionary of Corominas and Pascual, Anexo 24, 1984).

Among the philological editions of texts, the following have been the most influential: J. L. Rodríguez, ed., *El cancionero de Joan Airas de Santiago. Edición y estudio* (The Songbook of Joan Airas of Santiago; edition and study, Anexo 12, 1980) and J. Paredes, ed., *El cancionero profano de Alfonso X el Sabio. Edición crítica, con introducción, notas y glosario* (The Secular Songs of Alfonso El Sabio: a critical edition, with introduction, notes and glossary, Anexo 66, 2010).

In the monographs published from 1974 to 2010, the research areas most frequently investigated have been grammar (17 volumes), vocabulary (17), diachronic and dialectal variation,

in particular as regards grammar and vocabulary (13), and philological editions (4). The most popular topics for study have been the verb, the constituents of the clause, derivational morphology, the noun phrase, diatopic variation, diachrony, lexicology and lexicography.

In addition, several volumes of multiple authorship have been edited, the Acts of symposia and conferences on a variety of topics, including: G. Wotjak and A. Con especial consideración da situación prerromana* (Galician Onomastics, with particular emphasis on the Pre-Roman period, Anexo 58, 2007); *Estudos sobre léxico dos trovadores* (Studies on the Vocabulary of the Troubadours, 2008); and M. Arbor Aldea and A. F. Guiadanes (eds), *Estudos de edición crítica e lírica galego-portuguesa* (Studies on critical editions of Galician-Portuguese Lyric, Anexo 67, 2010).
